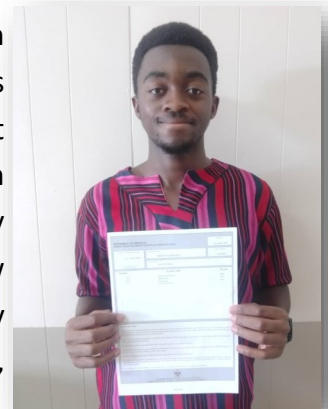


TUCSIN COMPLEMENTARY COURSE 2023

Tired of repeating low results, I aimed for significant improvement, particularly in subjects like Mathematics and Geography. Our math teacher at TUCSIN always emphasised the importance of practice tests every day when I had classes with him. Learning from successful peers, I adopted this new study approach, emphasizing daily practice tests. By the end of the first term, my efforts paid off, with improvements from D to C in Mathematics and Geography, and a B in Agriculture.



Encouragement from family and friends, along with prayers for success, motivated me, but doubts lingered. Fearing a decline from a current C to a D or E, I reminded myself of consistently ranking among the top 5 in all subjects. Recognizing that our teacher's challenging tests prepared us well, I trusted the process, ultimately tackling finals with ease. My preparation for the mock was different from the start to the end of the first term. I decided to take things to a whole other level when the second term began around June or July it was quite interesting I have been living in multiple locations. It would have been an excuse I would definitely use if I didn't perform well. During my journey to the Mock exam, I added more discipline actions to enhance and keep track of my performance in all my subjects.

I prioritized my struggles, starting with Mathematics. Dedicated to improvement, I tackled one full exam paper daily, often completing three. This disciplined routine, maintained from July to the finals in September, October, and November, allowed me to secure a C in Mathematics throughout the year. My achievements in 2023, making my family, friends, teachers, and TUCSIN proud, leave me with no regrets.
